The ***Developmental Disabilities Institute***, located in the Simons Building on Woodward Avenue, is a federally mandated program which provides education, community support, research, and information to disability programs statewide. The mission of the Institute is to contribute to the development of inclusive communities and quality of life for people with disabilities and their families. This mission is implemented through the Institute's many projects addressing a variety of life span issues in disability. Currently, ***the Institute is seeking bright, energetic students to assist in project implementation, including data collection, data analysis, report development, training, and dissemination activities.*** Projects that need student support include:

***Empowerment Education:*** This project provides training to direct care workers statewide. (Ms. Janks).

***National Family Support Training:*** This project will provide competency-based training to families and people with disabilities on family support and self determination. (Dr. LeRoy).

***CORE:*** This project develops and implements disability research projects across a wide variety of community needs. (Dr. LeRoy).

***Disability Futures:*** This project will record (video, Youtube) best practices in community support for persons with disabilities. (Dr. LeRoy).

***SAFE:*** This project will design and field test an emergency preparedness program for people with disabilities in the city of Detroit. (Ms. Janks)
