Project Description

The Michigan Developmental Disabilities Institute (MI-DDI) has partnered with Hope Trust to bring you the *Hope for Aging Caregivers* project. This project will guide family caregivers to plan for their loved one's future. Project participants will work with a Family Support Navigator (FSN) to use the Hope Trust platform to create a care plan. Hope for Aging Caregivers aims to improve the health and well-being of aging family caregivers of adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities (I/DD). The project will use new technology that enables coordinated, cost-effective and sustainable care planning.

Participant Recruitment

MI-DDI is recruiting a limited number of families. Family caregivers must support an individual with intellectual/developmental disabilities (I/DD). Caregivers must also be at least 50-years-old.

Participation in the project is completely **FREE**. Families who participate in the project will receive:

- Support from an FSN to guide the creation of a care plan for your loved one
- Draft of a special needs trust
