FOR YOUR CHILD WITH A MOTOR DISORDER?



The Conductive Learning Center of

North America (CLC) provides opportunities for individuals with motor challenges related to complications of prematurity, cerebral palsy, spina bifida, or other brain injury to achieve optimal physical, cognitive, and social independence through the education-based rehabilitation method of conductive education. Students work on physical-motor, social-emotional, communication, and activities of daily living in a group oriented, family centric setting that emphasizes motivation, self-esteem, and is delivered by conductor teachers.









Due to the growing need for services in our community for young children with motor challenges, CLC has developed the **Conducting Readiness Program** to improve independence, school readiness, and life-skills through early intervention for children 6 years of age and under.

The Conducting Readiness Program will provide <u>new families</u> with the chance to try a full, <u>four-week intensive session</u> of conductive education at a <u>highly-subsidized rate</u>. Candidates for the program must:

- ⇒ Be between the ages of 1 & 6 years old
- ⇒ Have a non-progressive motor disorder or motor delay
- ⇒ Be a child that may benefit from an intensive education service within a group setting

This education-based rehabilitation program capitalizes on the impacts of early intervention and is designed to help students gain confidence and the skills needed to be more successful in a standard school setting with fewer accommodations.
