Empowerment Education Training Initiative

The Michigan Developmental Disabilities Institute's (MI-DDI) Empowerment Education Training Initiative **provides free education to direct support professionals (DSPs)**, such as direct care workers, paraprofessionals, and teacher's aides. These trainings are provided by qualified direct support professionals who work with the Empowerment Education initiative. In the past, trainings have been hosted at schools, agencies, group homes, or any location where DSPs work. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, trainings are currently offered virtually.
