Faridah Ali Chang: Support for families and their high needs children during the COVID19 pandemic

Faridah is a Principal Trainer & Consultant in Rainbow Centre Training and Consultancy (RCTC) and a Registered Psychologist (Singapore). She has over 20 years of experience in special needs as a teacher and as a psychologist in early intervention and special education, specialising in parent and professional training. She is an experienced speaker on disability topics, presenting to the public, medical, and tertiary organisations in the Asia-Pacific region. She holds a Master of Arts (by Research) from the National Institute of Education with research on Quality of Life.

Paul Willner & Biza Stenfert Kroese: Effects of the pandemic on informal carers of adults and children with intellectual disabilities in the UK.

Biza is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist and Senior Researcher in Clinical Psychology at the School of Psychology, University of Birmingham, UK. She is also the founder and chair of CanDo, a Community Interest Company that supports parents with complex needs. Paul Willner is a Professor Emeritus in the Psychology department of Swansea University's College of Human and Health Sciences. They have led trail-blazing research on the use of mixedmethod research to identify the impact that COVID-19 has on individuals with intellectual disabilities and their families.

Regi Alexander: Guidance for the treatment and management of COVID-19 among people with intellectual disabilities

Regi is a Consultant Psychiatrist at Hertfordshire Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust, UK and a Visiting Professor at the University of Hertfordshire. He is President of the Intellectual Disability Section at the Royal Society of Medicine, Editor of the Oxford Textbook of Psychiatry of Intellectual Disability, Associate Dean of the Royal College of Psychiatrists and Convenor of RADiANT – a research consortium that brings together a NHS Trusts, universities, service users and family members.
