Hiring Self-Advocate Leaders as Trainers

The [Michigan Developmental Disabilities Institute \(MI-DDI\)](#) at Wayne State University is hiring individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities to serve as trainers. This is an hourly, contracted position. Trainers will train other individuals with disabilities about the Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Rule.

The HCBS Rule is important as it will make sure individuals have opportunities to live, love, work, and have fun in their communities.

Applications are due by **Monday, September 30, 2019**. The applications will be reviewed. Individuals will then be contacted for an interview.

If hired as a trainer, you will be expected:

- To attend the train-the-trainer event (date to be determined) which may require travel
- Attend monthly project staff meetings
- Participate in project conference calls
- Deliver training to people with disabilities, family members, and support staff, and
- Complete work at home in between meetings and trainings

To apply for this trainer position, you must be:

- An adult (18 and over) with an intellectual or developmental disability
- Receive community mental health supports
- Be willing to travel within your region of Michigan and have the ability to use transportation (public or private).
- Be free from a conflict of interest. This means you cannot be working for a provider agency or Community Mental Health.

This position is about 8-10 hours per week or 32-40 hours per month.
