


Michigan Report: National Core Indicators (NCI) Adult Consumer Survey Outcomes 2016



National Core Indicators

The National Core Indicators (NCI) is a national survey used by developmental disabilities agencies to evaluate the outcomes of services provided to individuals and families. It is used in 46 states including Michigan.

Key Areas of Concern

- Service planning
- Community inclusion

38,000 individual's with developmental disabilities receive services from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS).

In 2016, 435 of those individuals were randomly selected to complete the
