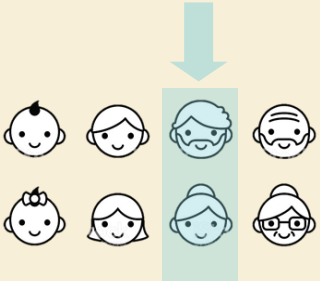




Michigan Report: National Core Indicators (NCI) Adult Consumer Survey Outcomes 2016

The average age: 45



2 out of 10 use self-directed supports



7 out of 10 have a guardian



7 out of 10 are related to their guardian



3 out of 10 have employment as a goal in their service plan



2 out of 10 have a paid job in the community



Of the people who do not have a paid job in the community, 4 out of 10 would like to



9 out of 10 like their home



3 out of 10 have a key to their home



5 out of 10 chose or had input in choosing their home



10 out of 10 have a primary care doctor



3 out of 10 have a healthy Body Mass Index (BMI)



6 out of 10 take at least 1 Mood/ anxiety/psychotropic medication

National Core Indicators

The National Core Indicators (NCI) is a national survey used by developmental disabilities agencies to evaluate the outcomes of services provided to individuals and families. It is used in 46 states including Michigan.

Michigan

38,000 individual's with Intellectual and/or developmental disabilities receive services from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS).

In 2016, 435 of those individuals were randomly selected to complete the NCI survey.
